# From the Chair...

# Annual Review of where we're going and how we need to get there.

The three, yea four main planks we're focusing on going forward for the time being with limited human and other resources are as follows:

- 1. East-West Rail: Has to be followed, ushered at every step and the cheers and boos accordingly for successes and failures. Good that £110 million is secured from the Chancellor's Autumn Statement for the railway, bad that there's going to be an upgraded highway running parallel taking land and delivering ever more volumes of traffic to junctions like A1, M1 and M40 as the north-south/east-west trunking systems meet and jam up.
- 2. **Northampton-Bedford:** A vital missing link should be done alongside and included in East-West Rail not addendum to or afterthought what planet are people on who think we can soldier on with town centres gutted and closing down and poorer people priced out and left behind by high tech and digital-on-line market driven delivery order-lines? Transport matters, as does lessening reliance on oil, but cutting demand through choice, not waiting until it becomes scarcer and prices rise and again people are cost-managed between ins and outs.
- 3. **Great Central:** There is a role for such a reopening to play. Providing north-south core capacity for West Coast Main Line, reducing the Rugby bottleneck which is holding more freight by -

rail scope back and free up the M1 which is also at saturation point. It needs a determined team!

4. Local Issues with Local People: The buses, pedestrians, cyclists, other transport matters and issues be they day to day or longer term matter to us. Having them cut or properly managed makes a huge difference to people's everyday lives, choices, reaches and ranges or not.

These options and challenges will require a steady stream of people and other resource to fund the work, enable proper cover and attention. They are not insignificant in opportunity and challenge worth. However last year (2016) we had 3 mainly active persons and others attached in smaller ways. We need a membership that turns out to meetings and supports us beyond giving a subscription; but gives support and enables potential to be actualised.

## Oxford-Bletchley Archive Side Show



Caption Middle Right: Circa 1987 looking south from a road bridge at the remnants of Calvert Station, former Great Central. The two right tracks were used for London waste transfer to landfill. But as well as the link at Claydon Junction heading eastwards to Bletchley for Bedford and Milton Keynes, there was talk in the early days of Chiltern's 20 year franchise of extending along the Great Central to the nodal point of Lutterworth, a few miles short of what ERTA wish for, for a link with the Leicester-Nuneaton lines. Central Rail wanted the corridor for a Channel Tunnel - East Midlands freight only line and now HS2 wants to assume the area with its passenger only (the flip side to Central Rail 20 years earlier) and a possible maintenance depot around the area.



**Top Left Caption:** The remnants at Verney Junction circa 1987. Following the 1985 decision to retain a single track between Claydon and Bletchley by slewing and 'dog's legging' to use the best remaining track and mitigate maintenance we have the spectacle of some trains being photographed left or right track-side when operational. Verney Junction was once where the Metropolitan Line came in via the branch from Quainton and on the other side of the twin island platforms was the line to Buckingham and ultimately Banbury. Whether this station will ever reopen again remains a mystery subject to a lot more housing to secure a justification of user potential for it. However any new rail link to Buckingham would have to avoid Padbury (blocked) and bypass Buckingham as the old route is blocked as well sadly, even though the population has grown to 12, 043 at the Census (source: 2011 Wikipedia https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Buckingham).



Bottom Left Caption: Back in 1989 Richard Pill poses for the camera having cycled from Sandy to Bedford, caught the train to Bletchley before setting out with members of the Railway Development Society (RDS) which ultimately finished at Bicester to highlight the East-West Rail glaring gaps and champion them to the media and public at large. Richard poses at Winslow Station in the remnant of the forecourt. The site was saved for a while by virtue of an old oak tree, but later was swept away and a new site for a new Winslow Station has been claimed by Councils in preparation for the return of the passenger train service to Bedford and Milton Keynes respectively heading east and Aylesbury and Oxford heading south and west.
